

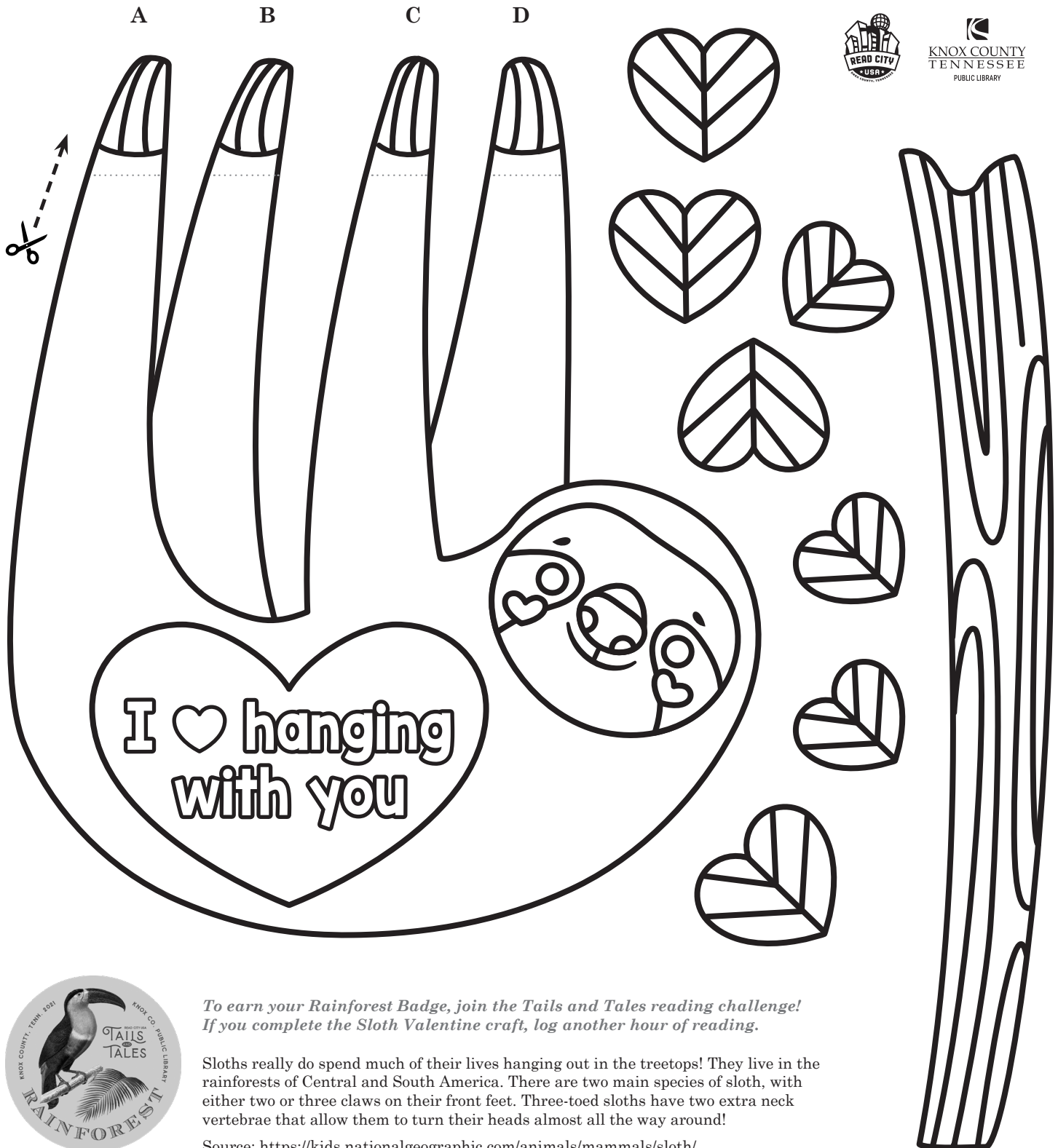
# Hanging Sloth Valentine A

Color and cut out your sloth, branch, and leaves. (*Hint: you may wish to color the back side of toes B and D, as they will show if you fold them over the branch.*) Glue your leaves to the ends of your branch. Position your sloth over your branch, sliding legs **B** and **D** underneath. Using the dotted lines as guides, fold legs **A** and **C** over the back of your branch; fold legs **B** and **D** to the front. Deliver to someone special!

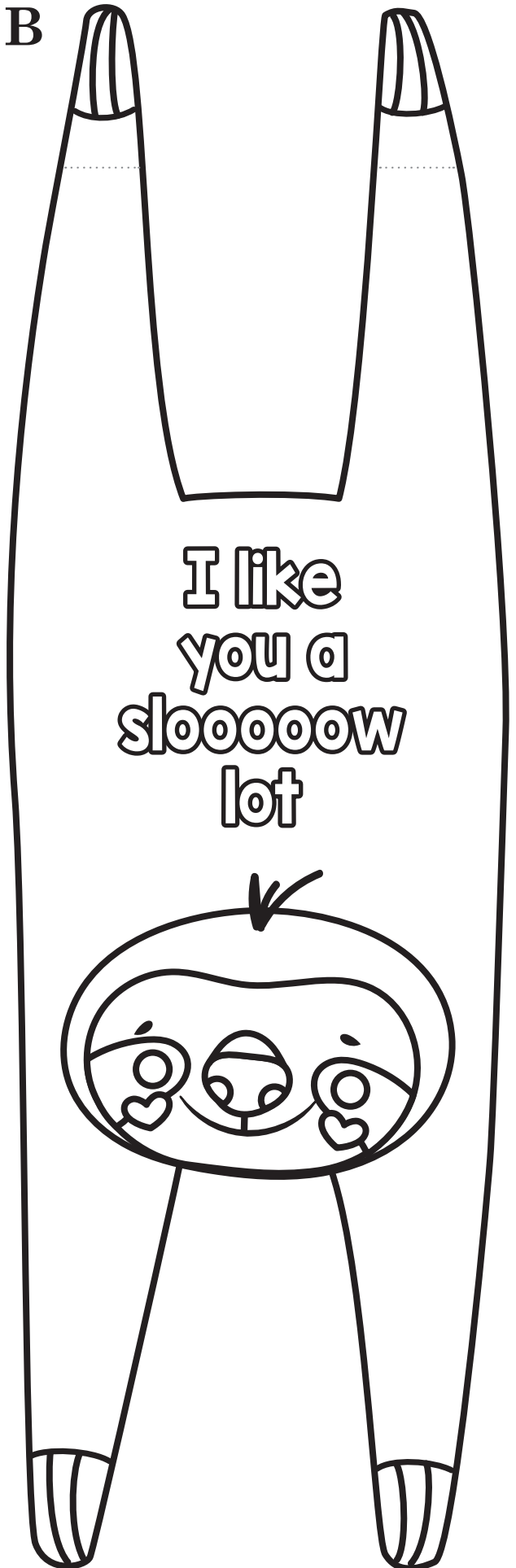
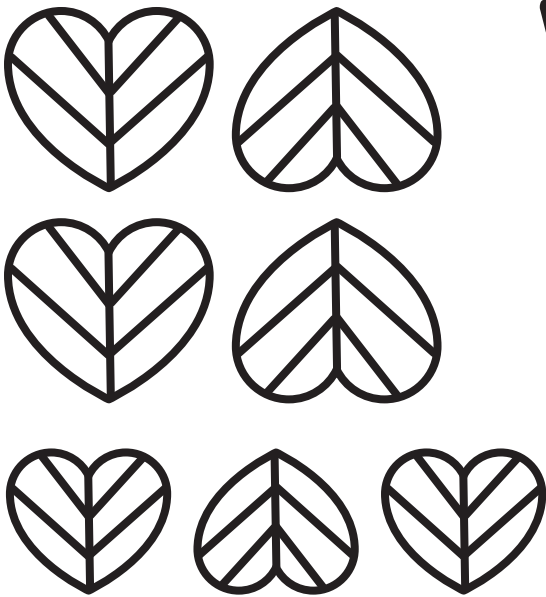
